

Scalable Performance Data Server[™] Software

Media Instructions, Release 2.2 (TS010)

for HP-UX[®]

Distribution is in the form of a tar tape/file. You must first restore the tar tape/file into a desired install directory on the SPD Server machine. It is recommended that you make a separate directory on the UNIX file system where you plan to install the software and restore it into that directory to keep the files in the distribution separate from other software packages and system files on your machine. For example, you may want to create a directory called `spds2_2` that you will use to install Release 2.2 (TS010). In the remainder of this document, the fully qualified path to this directory will be referred to as `InstallDir`.

For **tape distribution**, use the following commands:

```
cd InstallDir
tar -xvf /dev/rmt/Nm
```

where `N` is the tape unit number you will use.

Tape distribution is available on 4mm and 8mm tapes. No extra recording characteristics (density, compression, and so on) are specified when the tapes are created. Commonly your tape device will be unit 0. If you have multiple tape devices connected to your system, you will have to determine which unit number to specify. Assuming unit 0, your command sequence would be as follows:

```
cd InstallDir
tar -xvf /dev/rmt/0m
```

For **CDROM distribution**, use the following commands where `/dev/dsk/cxydy0` is the H/W path for the CD-ROM disk on the system:

```
mkdir -p /cdrom
mount -r -F cdfs /dev/dsk/cxydy0 /cdrom
cd InstallDir
tar -xvf /cdrom/spds.tar
```

Note: Mounting and unmounting a CD-ROM device requires root privileges. The remainder of the install process does not. After mounting the CD, you should return to the standard privilege set. Once you have the tar tape/file unpacked into the `InstallDir`, you should examine the *Scalable Performance Data Server Installation Guide* (`install-unix.html`). You will find this document on-line in the `InstallDir/doc` directory. This document will guide you through the remainder of the installation process and provide valuable information for the SPD Server administrator as well.

The installation guide includes a packing list for the product. It includes detailed instructions for completing the server-side installation and configuration, as well as the SAS client-side installation and configuration. It also refers you to additional on-line documentation for the product.

For documentation of enhancements and compatibility issues, see the *Scalable Performance Data Server Product Notes* (`prod-notes.html`).
