

Scalable Performance Data Server[®] Software Media Instructions, Version 3.0 (TS M3) for Compaq Tru64[™] UNIX[®]

Distribution is in the form of a tar file. You must first restore the tar file into a desired install directory on the SPD Server machine. It is recommended that you make a separate directory on the UNIX file system where you plan to install the software and restore it into that directory to keep the files in the distribution separate from other software packages and system files on your machine. For example, you may want to create a directory called `spds3_0` that you will use to install Version 3.0 (TS M3). In the remainder of this document, the fully qualified path to this directory will be referred to as `InstallDir`.

Use the following commands after you have mounted the CD-ROM:

```
cd InstallDir
tar -xvf /cdrom_mount_point/spds.tar
```

where `/cdrom_mount_point` is the mount point for your CD-ROM drive.

Once you have the tar file unpacked into the `InstallDir`, you should examine the *Scalable Performance Data Server Installation Guide* (`install-unix.html`). You will find this document online in the `InstallDir /doc` directory. This document will guide you through the remainder of the installation process and provide valuable information for the SPD Server administrator as well.

The installation guide includes a packing list for the product. It includes detailed instructions for completing the server-side installation and configuration, as well as the SAS client-side installation and configuration. It also refers you to additional on-line documentation for the product.

For documentation of enhancements and compatibility issues, see the *Scalable Performance Data Server Product Notes* (`prod-notes-v3.html`).
