ABSTRACT

During post-market clinical studies, when periodic summary reports are needed, providing large amount of information to busy doctors in clinical practice is a challenge. Using summary tables and graphics is a quick and intuitive way to convey the key message.

Since all data analysis is conducted within SAS®, creating reports in SAS has the advantage of making programming/validation easily manageable. The combination of using SAS/GRAPH® with the Annotate Facility and the new SAS ODS® LAYOUT feature helped tackle challenges.

This paper describes, in a PDF report, how to 1) give a table of contents with links to following pages; 2) provide links within documents that allow quick link to another page; 3) create sets of heavily customized graphs; 4) position summary tables and graphics for side by side comparison; 5) generate data driven dynamic report sent to multicenters worldwide.
